**“Slight Risk for Severe Thunderstorms Late Tonight
through Early Wednesday Afternoon”**

A potent storm system will move across South Texas Tonight and Wednesday bringing the potential for Severe Thunderstorms with Large Hail, Damaging Winds, and Isolated Tornadoes. The greatest chance of severe weather is along and north of a line from Laredo to Alice to Corpus Christi and includes much of Central and Southeast Texas.

Storms are expected to develop along the I-35 corridor between Cotulla and Laredo between midnight and 3 AM Wed. Storms will move eastward affecting the I-37 Corridor between 3 AM – 9 AM Wed. Storms should affect the Victoria to Rockport areas between 9 AM – 12 PM Wed, before finally exiting the region by 2 PM Wednesday Afternoon.

Residents of South Texas are encouraged to watch the weather closely tonight and Wednesday, and be prepared to seek shelter should severe weather threaten your location. Monitor the NWS Website, NOAA Weather Radio, Local News broadcasts, or websites for the latest weather information.

If severe weather or damage is observed, please relay those reports to your local National Weather Service or Law enforcement agencies after the storms have passed and it's safe to do so.
